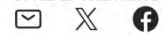

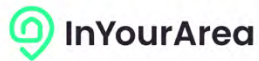

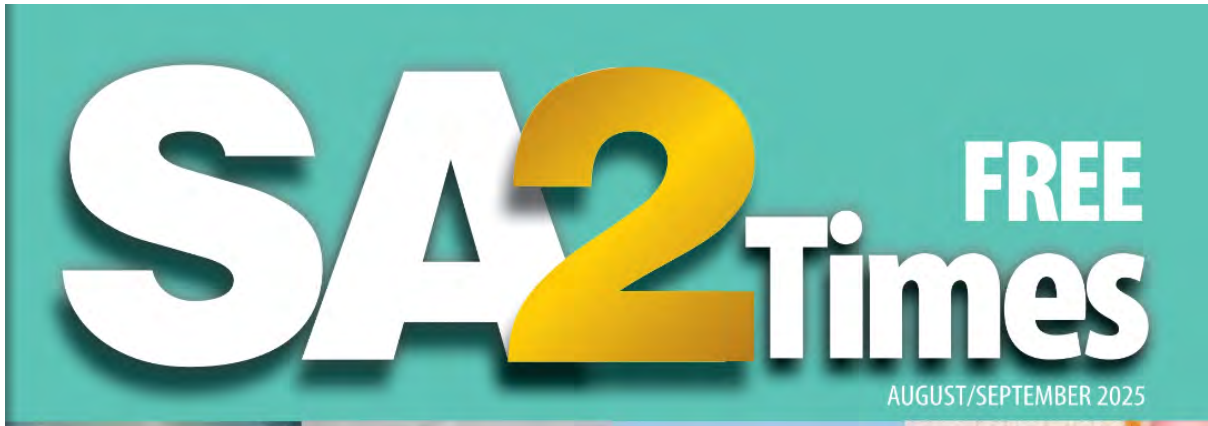

## WALKING BOOTS READY 🥾



This week, we caught up with Linda Welch from the Gower Walking Festival to fill us in about the return of this popular fixture in the Swansea calendar:

**Tell us about the Gower Walking Festival:** This year features more than 35 guided walks over nine days from Saturday 6th September. The programme includes familiar favourites plus exciting new routes and themes like football and jazz, ensuring something for all interests and abilities.

**How do you cater for different fitness levels?** It's not just for seasoned walkers. We have challenging walks up hills, but also shorter, flatter strolls. Walks are graded from one boot (easy, flat paths) to four boots (strenuous, challenging terrain). Distances range from 2 to 9 miles.

**Who are the volunteer guides?** Our walk leaders are experienced walkers, very knowledgeable about the landscapes and themes - whether it's award-winning author David Brayley on the Swansea football legends walk, Rob Edwards on industrial heritage, or Clive Scott on the Southgate Circular.

**Before you go... favourite pit-stop on Gower?** My personal favourite is Surfside Café at Llangland Bay - great menu, excellent bacon rolls, right on the beach with fabulous views when sunny, plus a cosy indoor space with log burner for winter.

## Gower Walking Festival 2025: Celebrating 21 Years of Exploring the Peninsula

The Gower Walking Festival began back in 2004, originally launched by the Mumbles Tourist Association as a fundraising initiative for the local tourist information office. Over the past two decades, it has grown into a major annual celebration of the landscape, culture and community of Gower – the UK's first designated Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The festival celebrated its 20th anniversary in 2024 with a record-breaking 71 walks across 16 days, drawing over 1,500 participants. Now, in 2025, it enters its 21st year with a fresh line-up of over 30 guided walks, each designed to showcase a different side of Gower's rich and varied landscape.

### What's in Store for 2025?

This year's festival takes place from Saturday 6 to Sunday 14 September, offering nine days of carefully curated walks for all interests and abilities. Whether you're a seasoned hiker or a curious newcomer, there's something for everyone – from rugged cliff-top hikes to family-friendly strolls.

### Some highlights include:

Coastal walks that trace the spectacular Gower shoreline, including favourites like Worm's Head and Rhossili Down.

Nature-themed experiences, including bat walks, birdwatching at dawn, and a golden-hour wildlife photography session.

Industrial and cultural heritage walks, such as exploring Kilvey Hill's mining past or tracing Swansea's jazz and football history.

Accessible and community-focused walks, including the free Forget Me Not Memory Walk and gentle routes through places like Clyne Valley and Oystermouth Cemetery.

Walks are graded from 1 to 4 boots – 1 being short and easy, 4 being long and strenuous – so it's easy to pick the right route for your comfort and fitness level. Most walks cost just £7, with proceeds reinvested into running the festival.

Two festivals are set to grace **Swansea** simultaneously this weekend promising a host of activities and musical performances. While the **Gower** Walking Festival promises a range of outdoor walks in some of Swansea's most picturesque locations the **Swansea** International Jazz Festival offers fun nights filled with musical delight at several venues across the city.

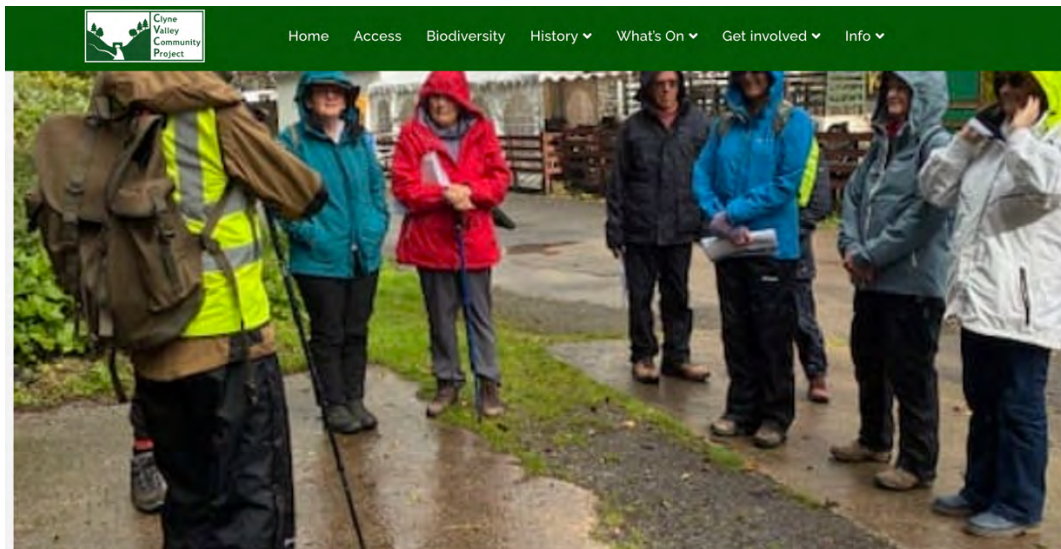

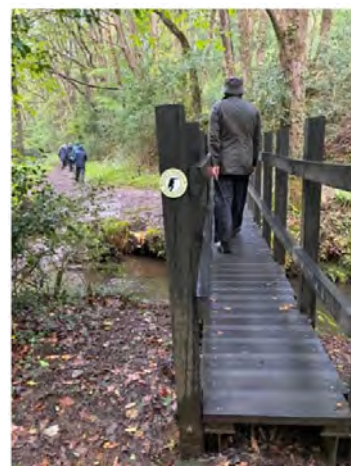


## Gower Walking Festival

14th September, 2025

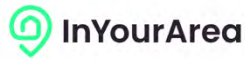

Gower Walking Festival is set to return next September after a successful 21 year anniversary celebration this year,

This year, participation figures were up on 2024, with nearly 400 walkers covering 170 miles of Gower and surrounding area, taking part in 35 walks.

Initial feedback on the nine day festival, officially launched by Lord Mayor of Swansea councillor Cheryl Philpott, has been very positive for the volunteers who run the event.

Now, organisers have announced that the 2026 festival will run from September 5 to 13.

New festival chair Linda Welch said: "It was a truly international festival with walkers coming from as far as away as the USA. As always, it was well supported by locals wanting to know more about the area they call home, but, equally, many of those joining the festival came from further afield, Scotland, the Midlands, Avon and Somerset, Hampshire, Oxfordshire and Bedfordshire. They were all drawn by the opportunity that the Gower Walking Festival provides to discover the beauty of the area. We are grateful to all our sponsors, supporters and everyone who led, back-marked and stewarded walks."

Linda paid tribute to her predecessor John Ashley, who stepped down at the end of this year's festival.

She said: "He has been involved from the beginning and we would like to thank him for his contribution over so many years. We're delighted that he has agreed to be our honorary president, so his knowledge and expertise will not be lost to us.
